Clean Up Pantego!!!! The Fall Clean Up Day will be on Saturday, October 14th from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 pm. This is for large and bulk items only; NO hazardous waste will be accepted. Acceptable items include mattresses, tables, shelving, wood flooring etc. Brush will be accepted UNTIL 3:00 p.m. ONLY. It will be on the corner of Winewood Dr. and S. Bowen Rd. at the south end of Town Hall. There will be no entrance from S. Bowen Rd.; it will be an exit only. Entrance is from Robin Rd. or Oakridge Dr. to Winewood Dr. going east. Please follow traffic control signage and cones for directions in & out of the event.

Mosquito Control

Take a personal stake in the process! Help prevent the breeding of mosquitoes by ensuring that the areas on your property have no standing water. Check your buckets, flower pots, trash containers, or other likely collection areas and dump them out on a regular basis. When going outside, especially from dusk to dawn, wear clothes that cover as much of your skin as possible and use insect repellent. Remember the 3 D's:



Dress in long sleeves and pants when you're outside or working in your yard. For extra protection, you may want to spray thin clothing with repellent.

DEET is the ingredient to look for in your insect repellent. Follow labeled instructions.

Drain standing water where you find it. Look for flowerpots, clogged rain gutters, etc. and anywhere mosquitoes could breed. For more information visit the Town's website: www.townofpantego.com. Thank you for your cooperation.

Mosquito dunks (one package per resident) are available at Town Hall to treat standing/stagnant water that cannot be emptied (i.e. ponds, fountains, etc.)

The Town Council recently adopted the annual budget for Fiscal Year 2017-2018, which begins October 1, 2017. This budget maintains the current tax rate of \$0.42 per \$100 and anticipates a reduction in sales tax collections and fines/fees. The 2017-18 budget maintains current staffing levels, and includes upgrades to public safety and public works equipment. Highlights of the budget include a significant number of capital projects. Among these is the repair and preservation of twenty-nine streets, for a total of 22,925 linear feet. As well, the Town intends to partner with Tarrant County Precinct 2 to share the cost for the asphalt mill and overlay of Arrowhead Drive, Roosevelt Drive, and Sarah Drive. Finally, a street drainage project is under design for the intersection of Garner and Smith Barry to alleviate street flooding. Among the water projects included for this year are scheduled maintenance on the Lane Paluxy and the Nora Paluxy water wells and the replacement of existing water meters with automated ones. Finally, the sanitary sewer line parallel to S. Bowen Rd. from Winewood Dr. to Smith Barry Rd. is scheduled for replacement.
